Intra School Events

- 6.07.18 It is very important that children in school have a creative expression. The students read books during the vacation and made artistic book covers as per their imagination. - 10.07.18 The English Intersection Competition for the students of class III and IV was held on the topic 'Every Picture Tells a Story', wherein the participants depicted a picture and spoke a few lines on it. Some of the depictions were 'A House', 'The Sun', 'The Earth', 'An Ice-cream', 'A Pencil', 'A Tree' and 'A butterfly'. First position was bagged by Mohd. Rayed of class IV B, second position was won by Alisha Rao of class IV A. Dikshant Gupta of class III A got the third position. Syeda Tasleem of class IV A won the consolation prizes.

- 12.07.18 The Inter Section Poster Making Competition for class XI was held with the topic “Summer Reverie”. The students designed posters with great enthusiasm. Shadman of class XI F won the consolation prize.



- 13.07.18 The Inter Section Science Activity was conducted for Class IV. They demonstrated simple experiments based on Light, Air, Reflection and Refraction and other interesting phenomenon. Mohd. Rayed, Siya Sri, Pallavi, Shreyansh Tiwari, Krishna Kohli, Ali Haider & Naman Jha of class IV B, Anoosh Fatima, Saima Azam & Sameeha Kidwai of IV A stood first and second respectively.



- 14.07.18 'Tangram' activity was held for the students of class VI. It was used as a puzzle where the seven pieces were arranged to make an object such as people, animals, letters etc. Tangram is used to develop problem-solving and logical thinking skills, perceptual reasoning (nonverbal thinking skills), visual-spatial awareness, creativity and many mathematical concepts. Anushka Singh of class VI C got the first position, M. Hanzala of class VI B got second position, Sachin and Alisha of class VI A shared the third position. Ritika, Misbah, Srishti, Suhani, Jyoti, Devansh & Irana Gupta of class VI won the consolation prize.

- 19.07.18 'Story Telling Using Puppets' under school's Theatre in Education' programme was organized for class VII based on display of puppet shows on stories such as , 'The Spider and the Fly' ' Matilda'. 'The Little Red Riding Hood '. The Pied Piper of Hamelin ' and 'The Christmas Spider'. The participants made use of finger, hand and stick puppets to show their respective stories. The event also included a PowerPoint Presentation on the history of puppetry in India to spread more awareness on the theme.

19.07.18 To sensitize the students about the problems faced by the visually challenged students, Meenakshi Chandwani addressed the students of VI, VII & VIII. She is an Alumnus of Cambridge School, Srinivaspuri, batch of 1998. Being visually impaired, she shared with students her experiences, challenges and successes & the role of school in her life. Through her efforts she has shown that no disability can be an obstruction in one's life. She advised the students not to complain and advised to help those who don't have a sight but they surely have a vision. She was able to touch the hearts of the young ones.

20.07.18 An Intersection Hindi Debate Competition was organized for the students of class VIII on the topic 'Jivan Mein Niyamom ka Hona Avashyak ho. Hayat Asim of class VIII A won the first position, Aditi Gaur of class VIII E and Eram Khan of class VIII A secured the second and third position respectively.

26.07.18 In an Intersection Hindi Vigyan Prastuti Competition, the students of class X created advertisement on the spot on commercial and social issues. First position was won by class X C & X E for their advertisement on Gathiya Jod Tel and X A was declared second for 'Fragon Chhapal'.



27.07.18 Class IX students participated in the Maths Intersection Competition in which they made models based on Mathematical concepts. The first position was bagged by IX A for making moving triangle and visualizing solid shapes, the second position was won by IX B for showing use of Heron's formula in real life & IX D got the third position for showing the use of mathematical concepts in rural and urban areas.



31.7.18 Under the Teachers Reading Programme, the teachers deliberated on the book 'The Last Mughal' by William Dalrymple at ERC. The teachers from our school presented an analysis on the Introduction and chapter of the book.

Workshops & Seminars

- 5.07.18 The Schneider Electric organized a workshop on 'Conserve My Planet for class VI & VII. It is an energy conservation programme initiated in the school and was organized to outline the plan to be followed in school. The electricity bill analysis will be done by the students who participated in the conservation programme. The workshop also included the gender sensitization initiative by an organization 'Jagriti'.



- 12.07.18 An Orientation Programme was organized for the students of Astronomy Club 2018-19. Mr. Tarun was the Resource person from Space Organisation. The programme began with a quiz on astronomy. A video on different astronomical events was shown to arouse interest in the students.

- 13.07.18 Chemistry Department conducted a presentation on the topic "Materials Revolution and Human Development." Five areas of interest – Metals, Radioactivity, Petrochemicals, Portland cement and Nano materials were explained using videos and power point presentation. It was followed by an interactive session with the teachers.



- 19.07.18 The students of Class XI and XII participated in a Career Workshop conducted by Group Captain Sajal Kundu. He laid emphasis on how a career in the Defence forces promises to be one of the most prestigious and respected positions in the country. Youngsters who aspire to choose a career of excitement, adventure, and challenges can find no better place than defence to meet all their professional expectations. The interactive session was received well by the students and it ended with question & answer session.

- 27.07.18 Art Department chose the topic 'Art movements of the 20th Century', as a part of Teachers Enrichment Programme. It was an informative and captivating presentation reflecting a very important era of Western Art explaining how "Expressionist Movement" inspired different artists and choreographers of the 20th century.

Educational Excursions

- 18.07.18 The students of class IX attended the '**Nelson Mandela International Day**' organized by the United Information Centre & Working Group on Alternative Strategies to commemorate Nelson Mandela's 100th Birthday at India International Centre. The students were to go prepared on the life, struggle & mission of Nelson Mandela for interaction with the speakers. Our student Tejas of Class-IX was one of the Flag bearers. They all marched holding hands and singing 'We Shall Overcome' and spoke on the indelible mark left behind by Nelson Mandela.



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20.07.18 The students of class IX visited the 'National Science Centre' Delhi and explored the different exhibits & experiments and had fun with science based interactive activities and witnessed thematic exhibitions. This included Fun Science Gallery, Science and Technology Heritage Gallery, Prehistoric Life Gallery, and Human Biology Gallery. They also attended a Science Show and enjoyed unraveling the science behind magic by understanding the concept of air pressure, tesla coil, and much more. This was followed by a Nuclear Power Show projecting a virtual tour of Nuclear Power Corporation of India which illustrated how electricity is generated through atoms. It was an enriching experience for all the students.
- 29.7.18 The Delhi Commission for Protection of Child Rights organized a one day conference on – 'Delivering Quality Education'. Sessions were held at different venues on 'Community and Parental Engagement', and 'Creating a Participatory School' etc. The eminent speakers were Mr. Manish Sisodia, Hon'ble Deputy Chief Minister, Govt of NCT of Delhi, Mr. Ramesh Negi, Chairperson of DCPCR. The theme of the plenary session was 'Bridging Learning Deficit'. The conference was attended by Ms. Sonali Chattopadhyay, HOD Political Science Deptt, Mr. Varun Kumar from Maths Deptt and Ms. Rida Kulsum student of class XI Humanities. The speaker laid emphasis on Compassion, Equity, Dialogue and happiness curriculum for child centric teaching.

Scholar Badge Ceremony

The school organized the Scholar Badge Ceremony for the students of classes VI to XI for the academic session 2017-18. The ceremony was attended by the parents of the young achievers. The programme began with a talk on the importance of success and achievement in life. School Principal Mrs. Seebaluck, presented the students with scholar badges and applauded the achievements of young scholars, encouraging them to strive for academic excellence.

18.07.18 In the Felicitation Ceremony for class XII, Chhavi Atal, the overall topper from Commerce with 97.2 % was awarded a trophy. The stream toppers Aryaman Sharma – Science 96.6%, Ira Bhatnagar - Humanities 93%, Bhavya Gupta- Fashion Designing 97.2% were felicitated with the certificates of appreciation.

52 students scored 90% and above and were given certificates. The Principal congratulated the students and said that the performance of these students should serve as an inspiration for the subjects of class XI & XII.

CBSE CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

- a. Mrs. Meenu Mehra attended the workshop conducted by CBSE – Centre of Excellence under its Capacity building Programme for Social Studies at Guru Harkrishan School, India Gate on 26.7.17 & 27.7.18. It was conducted by Ms. Vijay lakshmi Singh (Ex Principal Salwan Public school, Additional Director). The workshop began with the premise that Social Studies as a subject carries a normative responsibility to create and widen the popular base for human values. So the study of Social Science should be aimed at investing in a child moral and mental energy so as to make him/her capable of thinking independently and to deal with forces that threaten these values without losing the individuality. The resource person then went on to summarise the eight multiple intelligences and emphasized the need among educators to focus their attention on these intelligences rather than on linguistics and logical mathematical intelligence.



- b. Ms. Prachi Anand attended the workshop conducted by CBSE - Centre of Excellence under its Capacity Building Programme for English teachers of class X at Delhi Public School, Mathura Road on 27.7.18 & 28.7.18. It was a platform for professional development and subject-based interaction among the teachers. Ms. Ruchi Sengar, the resource person, engaged all the participants in subject-oriented communicative activities which aimed towards upgrading the pedagogy with the application of modern enrichment resources such as quick worksheets, group and peer work, and language games. Ms. Sengar centred her activities around the development of key language skills such as Reading, Story and Letter Writing, Grammar and Listening. The teachers were also given the task of preparing a lesson plan based on one of the prescribed literary texts for class X by using the handout provided by the CBSE.

MOCK DRILLS

To create an enabling environment for school safety and to spread awareness amongst students and the school staff, an earthquake preparedness drill was conducted on 25.07.18. This was to help students know the school evacuation routes during emergency & and give training to students with three basic steps i.e. Drop, Cover & Hold during an earthquake. The evacuation drill was successfully conducted and the students showed great enthusiasm in learning about the preparedness at the time of disaster.



ENRICHING HORIZONS

- 11.07.18 Class XI and XII students attended a lecture by Mr. Ashok Sajjanhar, former Ambassador of India in Central Asia on the topic “Current Missile Crisis in North Korea”. The lecture traced the background and the history of the formation of North Korea as a modern nation state. It also gave insights in to the current missile crisis the North Korea’s is undergoing. He spoke about the role of USA and India with North Korea and also analyzed the future of India’s International relation with North Korea. It was organized by Educational Resource Centre (ERC).
- 31.7.18 In collaboration with the Delhi State Legal Service Authority of the District Court Saket, a guest lecture was organized by Political Science department for the students of class XI. The speaker was Ms. Rakhshan Ahmed, an advocate of South East District Court Saket. The speaker talked about Child Abuse and Sexual Violence and Interpersonal and Digital World. The objective of this lecture was to educate the students about legal literacy on child protection starting from bullying to sexual harassment. It was mainly focused on different kinds of sexual harassment and POCSO Act (Protection of Children from sexual offences Act and Juvenile Justice Acts. The students were informed about the reporting procedure of such kind of cases.
