Deb Memorial Lecture was organised in Cambridge School, Srinivaspuri on 30th October 2017 in memory of the visionary educationist and founder, Mr. Alok Chandra Deb. The event began with the lighting of lamp by Mr. Jairam Ramesh, Member of Parliament and Dr. Kalyani Roy, Secretary, Society for the Advancement of Education. The Guest Speaker of the day, Mr. Jairam Ramesh spoke about the necessity of quality education to modernize India and to develop discipline in order to acquire both intensive as well as extensive knowledge. He also spoke of the importance of reading as children growing up in a technologically advanced world often forget the virtue of real-world interactions and become numb to the idea of social empathy.
